Pupils from Year 8 to Year 12 ventured on a trip of a lifetime to South America during the Easter break. The group were based for three days in Buenos Aires followed by a week in the Patagonian regions of El Chalten and El Calafate.

This trip was a joint venture between the Spanish, Geography and Science departments - a clear example of teamwork in action! Pupils were provided with the opportunity to participate in a range of incredible experiences. The adventurers discovered Argentina's National Park - Los Glaciares, they learnt to dance like a local during a Folklorica lesson and learnt about glaciation and local flora during a hike to Laguna Torre and Laguna de los Tres, under the Fitz Roy massif.

Pupils also visited a working cattle centre and camped in Chile's Torres Del Paine National Park where they hoped to spot the Magellanic Clouds, which are only visible in the Southern hemisphere.

There was an opportunity to meet up with pen pals at a Chilean school and finally, they hiked to Las Torres to work on a case study of the impact of tourism on the National Park. They focused on the regional fauna. gazed on guanacos and always remembered to keep their eyes peeled for condors!
